HURRICANE DEBRIS

Since the start of debris collection, **3,890 truckloads** from Cape Coral Streets, totaling **187,442 cubic yards.**

Hurricane debris must be placed at the curb in three separate piles.

- Bring ID to show you are a Cape Coral resident. Do not place debris in bags.
